A Mammoth Named Asiel

Mammoths are usually pictured in the snow because they have been found preserved in the far north. Yet the food in their mouths and stomachs has always been subtropical. This is because after the flood, with warm oceans and cold land, there was a one time ice age due to heavy snowfall that did not all melt. However, around the arctic ocean, the climate was warm until the sea cooled and the mammoths were trapped in a winter storm.

So it should be no surprise that mammoth fossils are found in Texas. And, of course, they grow them big there! Asiel was found in the small town of Clute near Houston, Texas. Joe helped excavate it. A&M University did most of the work. A student found a wooden bowl at the site; a first. When cleaning and reidentifying the bones, Joe found two pieces of pottery; another first. There were Ice Age bones all around with signs that they were on the surface at least ten years.

Plus, the bones were 35 feet below the surface in sand and 15 feet below current sea level. On the right is one of the pottery pieces. It is jet black. Black clay comes from Mexico. It appears to have been used for a tool.

Have you considered...

...the pterosaurs or flying reptiles. We grew up calling them pterodactyls.

Evolutionists say these flying reptiles and man did not live together. Yet we know from the Bible that these pterosaurs were created on Day five. Noah took some on board the Ark. Many cultures from around the world speak of pterosaurs, but they use a different name. In Isaiah 14:29 and 30:6, we find Isaiah mentioning "fiery flying serpents". Or maybe you have heard of the "legend" of the thunderbird. It was a large creature with a bony crest, fierce claws on its wings, and a long, sharp beak. When it flew, its wings thundered. It was a fearful creature to behold! Stories and descriptions of thunderbirds appear in the Indian cultures from Alaska to South America. Ancient Indian artwork depict these flying creatures. For example, an Ica Burial stone from Peru displays a drawing of pterosaur. Indian pictographs in Utah portray a flying creature with a crest on its head - looking very much like a pterosaur. Herodotus (460BC) writes of flying reptiles in ancient Egypt and Arabia. They had a snake-like body and bat-like wings (flying serpents). Aristotle said that in his time it was common knowledge that these bat-like creatures lived in Ethiopia. Strabo describes flying reptiles living in India. Even today, there are reports of these flying creatures in Papua New Guinea and the jungles of Africa. They are even reported to glow in the dark. If man had never seen these flying reptiles, why do ancient peoples have stories and art work about them? Man and flying reptiles (pterosaurs) did live together.
