Whale Evolution: What Do The Bones Actually Show?

This Whale Evolution talk will focus on the proposed timeline of whale evolution, the changes that have been made over the last few decades, and what the bones really show. Special whale adaptations will be used to show the complexity of these special water dwelling mammals and the improbability that they evolved from land mammals, but were instead created on the 5th day of creation.

Eric Christenson teaches Biology and Marine Biology at a suburban Twin City high school.

... Saudi Arabia? Under Saudi Arabia's sand dunes archeologists are finding that it was once a wellwatered place! Fossils have been found of an extinct jaguar, oryx, a giant elephant with 7.4 foot long tusks and other artifacts. How surprising to find Saudi Arabia, the land of sand dunes, a once rich green landscape! How does this fit into the biblical timeline? After the Flood of Noah's time, many of the world's deserts were lush and green; the warm post-Flood oceans (as a result of the fountains of the deep breaking open and the volcanic activity) would have had a high evaporation rate and produced abundant amounts of rainfall near the equator. TCCSA's STATEMENT OF BELIEF
