Science and the Age of the Earth

June 19, 7:30 PM, Totino Bldg. Room F2128, Univ. of Northwestern, 3003 N Snelling, Roseville, MN Helmut Welke is a retired engineering manager who is the founder and president of Quad-City Creation Science Assoc. and a member of CRS and a speaker for Logos Research Assoc.

This talk will review the origin of the idea of Millions of years and the methods of Carbon-14 dating. Several other scientific findings that pertain to the age of the earth including some startling results will be discussed.

Have you considered...

... shale, the rocks made of mud (mudrock)? Try this experiment: place in a jar of water, dirt made of mud, silt, and sand; now shake, watch how the sand and silt particles fall rapidly to the bottom and then notice how the mud stays suspended in the water. Mud particles are thin and flat, like snowflakes, taking a long time to settle to the bottom. This experiment led scientists to believe that shale layers like the 500 foot thick Bright Angel Shale in the Grand Canyon or the 900 foot thick Marcellus Shale in the Pennsylvania area took millions of years to be deposited. HOWEVER, geoscientists have newly discovered that if the mud particles are in <u>rapidly moving water</u> they settled quickly. Scientists used a racetrack flume in which water and dirt flowed around and around in a circle. They found as the water accelerated, it caused the mud particles to be deposited rapidly, the same as sand particles.

How was this possible? Fast moving mud particles clumped together becoming the size of sand grains. Mud particles have a weak residual electrical charge, in fast moving water, these tiny mud plates were forced so close together that the oppositely charged particles attracted causing the mud to clump. The clumped mud settled quickly resulting in mud layers forming quickly. Mudrocks (shale) make up most of the geological rock layers, more than limestone and sandstone. Scientific evidence is showing mudrock layers can form in minutes in high energy conditions; it does not take millions of years! Was there a world-wide Flood resulting in formation of layers of shale, limestone and sandstone? Science is finally catching up with the Bible!


