Have you considered...

...the difference between grasshoppers and locusts? Nothing, grasshoppers and locust are the same species, the same creature! When scientists varied the environment for the grasshoppers, it changed into locust. This Jekyll/Hyde transformation was amazing! First the behavior changed: the loner grasshoppers started to swarm together. Then in the following generations, physical changes appeared. The grasshopper morphed from large legs, wings and bodies to a locust with smaller legs, wings, and bodies with an increase of 30% in brain size. By changing the environment again, scientists discovered they could reverse the locust back to grasshoppers, all the while the DNA remained the same. DNA has the ability to be expressed differently as the environmental conditions change. A set of switches can turn genes on and off in response to environmental conditions this is called epigenetics and is actually fairly common. Are grasshoppers and locust the same? YES! "What the gnawing locust has left, the swarming locust has eaten; And what the swarming locust has left, the creeping locust has eaten; And what the creeping locust has left, the stripping locust has eaten." ~Joel 1:4 https://creation.com/bad-things-in-creation

TCCSA's STATEMENT OF BELIEF
